Ruby Bennett


Ruby grew up in North Carolina listening to "country and hillbilly" music.(that's what it was called back then) Ruby says: After supper we would gather around the fireplace and my grandfather, dad, and my uncles would pick and sing. My dad Ervin Lewis played the banjo with the Carolina Boys here in Michigan. My uncle Ralph Lewis played with Bill Monroe in the 70's and went on to play bluegrass until he passed away at 89 years old. Ruby's son Steven Bennett still follows in the family tradition in bluegrass music as does my grandson Kermit Burke III (Bub). People say I am "Bluegrass to the Bone" and I guess I am.

I got to know many of the bluegrass bands when I owned a restaurant in Ecorse Michigan for many

Greg Cahill

Greg is well known nationally and internationally as the leader of Special Consensus, a Grammy nominated band he has lead since 1973. Greg has worked continuously for bluegrass in the International Bluegrass Music Association, the Foundation for Bluegrass Music and other organizations.

He is being honored in Southeast Michigan for his work promoting bluegrass in the schools in our area. Greg and Special Consensus presented 92 assemblies in various schools between 1985 and 1997. Other national touring groups later followed his example in our area.

David Conley, Sr.

David is a well know musician who is currently a member of Out of the Blue. He comes from a musical family and has played guitar for over 60 years. He was a founding member of the West Michigan Bluegrass Music Association and a member of their board of directors.

David has lead guitar workshops at area festivals over the years.

Duane has played bluegrass for most of his life, in various configurations. These include the The Detroit Bluegrass Band, Metro Grass, and Jericho Road. He is currently a member of New County Grass and Kim Robins and 40 Years Late.

George was an early contributor to our music, playing with Ralph Paige and Dick Dieterle in the County Line Boys beginning in 1969.

He is now 86 and sits in with the RFD Boys at the Ark in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The RFD Boys

The RFD Boys are celebrating their 50th year together and, always with a steady local gig, have become an Ann Arbor institution. They performed together for the first time on December 11, 1969; the venue was Mr. Flood's Party and the band quickly developed a following. After a brief but eventful stint at LUMS restaurant, they moved downtown to the Pretzel Bell restaurant where they played to a packed house 50 weekends per year for 13 years.
